Write a potion recipe/instructions on how/when to use it. (inspired by George's marvellous medicine)</p>	<p>Imagine you are on a train. Where would the train take you? Write a diary entry of your train experience.</p>
<p>Measure your height and the heights of others in your family.</p>	<p>What do you know about fractions? Create an information sheet all about fractions.</p>	<p>What common 3D shapes can you find in your home?</p>	<p>Choose 2 different localities (rainforest, village, city, coast, etc) and compare them making notes of differences AND similarities.</p>
<p>Read a book in a really unusual place. Take a picture.</p>	<p>Use materials to build a bridge that will hold the weight of a toy car</p>	<p>Write a poem or a song about recycling to encourage others.</p>	<p>Go on a shape hunt around your home. Count how many different 2D and 3D shapes you can find. See if you can spell them!</p>
