## DECORATE AN EGG

Use your imagination to decorate an egg. Look on the Internet for some ideas!



You could blow the contents out first (with an adults help) OR hard boil it first.

## STILL LIFE DRAWING

Complete an observational drawing of a daffodil (or another Spring flower).




Remember to use a sharp pencil and focus on your sketching skills (sketch lightly with small strokes- you won't need a rubber). Look closely at the finer details and consider where the shadows are.

## REVIEW AN EASTER/SPRING STORY

Read an Easter or Spring story that you have at home (or find one online). E.g. 'The Tiny Seed' or 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle.

Write a book review about it. Include a summary of the plot, a description of the main characters and your personal opinion.



## ESTIMATION

Fill containers with mini eggs, jelly beans or something similar.

Estimate how many are in each container. Write down your predictions then count to check.



Tip: Try to count in groups of 2s/5s etc. to make your counting quicker!

## EASTER BAKING

Follow a recipe to bake some Easter treats.


Remember to measure the ingredients accurately and ask an adult for help when using the oven.



## EGG & SPOON RACE

Get some spoons and something to balance on them (hard boiled eggs, plastic eggs, a dog treat, etc).

Make sure you have a start and finish line then have an 'egg and spoon race' in your garden.



## EASTER CARDS

Design and make a pop-up Easter card. There are many different designs to look at on-line and your family were probably egg-sperts at these when they were younger!



## WATCH FAMILY FILM

Make a den, grab some Easter snacks and have a movie afternoon with your family.



## FLOWER PRESSING

Choose a flower from your garden or during one of your walks. Put the flower between 2 pieces of tissue and then between some pages of a book. Put something heavy on top (a heavier book, tin of beans, etc). Leave for a few days then see what your pressed flower looks like.



## EASTER BUNTING

Cut out and decorate some rabbits, carrot shapes, eggs or any other shapes. Thread these onto a piece of string or wool to create some Easter bunting.
